



Percentiles rank the current EMI for the given period. A percentile of 0 indicates the EMI is at the lowest point, A percentile of 50 indicates the EMI is the median price, A percentile of 80 means the EMI has been lower 79% in the period (or higher 19% of the time in the period).

The strong market during the previous sale appeared to trigger further support this week, sending the AWEX-EMI to a 29 cent gain for the sale. It came on top of a 26 cent gain last week and made it the largest weekly rise in seven months. The sale opened with sharp rises across the whole Merino fleece sector. 19-microns came under special attention and jumped 40 to 50 cents clean while all other microns generally improved by an equally impressive 30 cents and pushed the EMI to a daily gain of 24 cents. Thursday saw another lift in the EMI but this time it was more moderate, firming by 5 cents. Most of the increase on the day was due to a strong Sydney market which found good support on the back of that region's smallest Merino Fleece offering since 2009. Both Melbourne and Fremantle closed out the week on a less positive footing however. Melbourne generally eased 5 cents on the back of their large offering while Fremantle dipped 10 cents late in the day. As with recent weeks the Merino Skirting sector followed their Fleece counterparts higher but the increases were generally not as large. Crossbreds made healthy gains in the finer 25/26-micron range on the back of fairly limited numbers. Merino Carding types continue to consolidate at current levels, closing largely unchanged for the second consecutive week. Sales resume in two weeks time, returning after the annual one-week Easter recess.


