National livestock identification scheme (NLIS) - useful information and FAQs

Local Land Services are key partners in Australia's National Livestock Identification System (NLIS), the national traceability system for cattle, sheep and goats.

It is a requirement in NSW for owners of livestock such as cattle, sheep, goats and pigs to be registered on the NLIS and have a Property Identification Code (PIC) and when trading or moving these livestock.

District vet advice - recent losses from barbers pole worm

While not widespread across central west, landholders experiencing good seasons also need to be aware of potential animal health issues, particularly barber's pole worm.

In the last month landholders around the southern area of the central west LLS region have lost sheep due to increased cases of barber's pole worm.

Central West LLS District Vet Belinda Edmonstone is warning landholders in these regions to beawareoftheissueandmanageaccordingly.

Our district vets work with ratepayers and groups via field days to keep producers updated on the latest advance in management, parasite control, feeding and nutrition issues and changes to livestock programs.

Wild dog concerns for local landholders

Our region has been fortunate in the past to have had little known predation from wild dogs on our sheep and livestock industry.

However wild dogs move across the landscape mainly at night time, searching for easy prey or to establish a new area where the opposite sex is accepting of the territorial move.

The obvious signs of dog activity, both from domestic and wild dogs, usually occur on the change of the season from summer to autumn, as the night time temperature become colder and their demands a higher ratio of protein to combat the cool conditions.

Waterwatch - local students making a difference

During May, our staff and hundreds of school students from Wellington, Geurie, Dubbo, Narromine, Warren, Marra Creek and Quambone visited sites on the Macquarie River to test water quality in a bid to determine the health of our river. The students also collected water bug samples. These water bugs are either sensitive or tolerant to differing water quality within their natural environments. Waterwatch is a national water quality monitoring initiative through which people in the community become actively involved in protecting and managing local waterways and catchments. The results of the water quality data collected from 17 sites along the Macquarie River will be entered into the WaterWatch database. This will enable an ongoing record of the water quality in the Macquarie River which anyone can access via the website.


