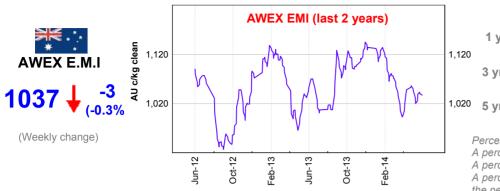

# **AWEX Woolshed Weekly**

The Weekly Wool Report for the woolshed.

Thursday, 5 June, 2014







Percentiles rank the current EMI for the given period. A percentile of 0 indicates the EMI is at the lowest point, A percentile of 50 indicates the EMI is the median price, A percentile of 80 means the EMI has been lower 79% in the period (or higher 19% of the time in the period).

Volumes continued to dwindle this week when a two-centre series offered 27,577 bales, the smallest offering in ten months. That total also included a New Zealand catalogue which sold in isolation on Tuesday and remained largely unchanged. The Australian component commenced selling on Wednesday but the movements were conflicting. Melbourne firmed slightly however Sydney fell by 10 to 15 cents after it had overshot the overall market in the preceding sale. The ensuing result was a narrowing of the price gap between the two markets. Thursday resulted in little action with the market generally tracking sideways. While the finer microns remained reasonably buoyant, especially the better spec types, the AWEX-EMI was dragged marginally lower by the medium/broader range which struggled to hold their ground and eased 5 cents clean. The smallest Merino Skirtings catalogue for the season found good support for the limited number of low vm types (<3%vm) while higher vm types remained steady. Crossbreds were also in limited quantity and made only slightly movements for the sale. Cardings types returned to the positive side of the ledger with buyers pushing them 5 to 10 cents higher. Fremantle returns to the selling program next week, contributing to an expected 35,597 bales around the nation.
