Pimelea poisoning in cattle

February 2015, Dr Jillian Kelly, Regional Vet

In the last few months we have found a plant called Pimelea in the Central West Local Land Services region.

The reason this is significant is that it causes illness and death in cattle. While historically it has been reported to grow in this area it has not been recognised by property owners or local vets as causing a problem until now.

Pimelea simplex has been found near Carinda, and Pimelea trichostachya has been found near Girilambone.

Pimelea likes red soil. It is a common cause of poisoning in cattle in south west Qld and the syndrome in cattle is often called "St Georges Disease" because that's the location it is most commonly seen.

The clinical signs in cattle are:

- fluid swellings (oedema) under the jaw and brisket
- diarrhoea
- weight loss
- anaemia
- reluctance to move
- depression
- standing away from the mob
- severely affected animals may die.

Locust update - report your activity

Swarm activity is now being reported across several areas within the Central West Local Land Services region. Biosecurity Officers are validating swarm densities, the environmental factors and locations.

Landholders need to contact Local Land Services to report any locust activity on their land.

Chemical volume and type is issued according to the infestation size and the species. Chemical will not be issued over the counter (as per DPI Policy and Procedure) without a prior inspection or prior arrangement from staff.

Please note the date on the side of the drum is the date of manufacture, not the expiry. Chemical is regularly tested to check it is OK.

1080 and Pindone courses near you

<u>Contact your nearest Local Land Services office</u> to find out when the next 1080 or Pindone course is running and register your interest.

Our staff run short training courses regular which will allow you to use 1080 and Pindone baits on your property.

The three-hour course will give you a clear understanding of 1080 and Pindone use and your legal obligations.

The AQF chemical application courses remain a requirement for use of any other pesticide.

The training courses are delivered by Local Land Services biosecurity officers and cover topics such as baiting techniques, toxicity, storage, transport, legislation and OH&S. Those completing the course will be issued a certification card and will remain accredited to use 1080 and Pindone for five years.

A small fee is charged for the course.

Farm Household Allowance


The Farm Household Allowance provides eligible farmers and their partners who are experiencing financial hardship with assistance and support to improve their long-term financial situation.
