

## Report locust sightings

Be vigilant about reporting locust activity in your area.

We have had 35 reported sightings in January and the two hot spots are north of



Collie heading towards Armatree, west Tooraweena and Curban areas.

Swarm activity would have been seen in these areas around mid-December.

Continuous ground and aerial inspections will take place to confirm reported sightings. Upon

inspection, biosecurity staff recommend the best way to control locust bands.

We encourage you to report any locust activity on your property.

## Green Army installs educational signs at Narromine

On 29 January, Federal Member for Parkes, Mark Coulton, met with Green Army participants at Narromine Rotary Wetlands to install educational signage.



The six signs were funded by Central West Local Land Services with a small grant Mr Coulton encouraged Riversmart and Narromine Rotary Club to submit, as part of the first Green Army program in the central west.

The team is supporting Riversmart's ongoing work along the Macquarie River by controlling weeds and revegetating public lands along the Macquarie River between Narromine and Warren, as part of their on-going NatureLinks program.

The Green Army is a practical, grassroots environmental program that supports local environmental and heritage conservation projects across Australia. Each Green Army team comprises 10 people, a team leader and 9 others. Team members have to be between 17 and 24 to participate and sign up for 26 weeks.
