New biosecurity tool for alpaca producers

Australia's alpaca industry plays an important role in the livestock value chain with an estimated 150,000 animals across the country. A recently developed <u>biosecurity tool</u> will help prevent and control diseases in both alpacas and llamas.

Emergency animal diseases and plant pests in NSW - call the hotline

Most <u>emergency animal diseases</u> such as foot and mouth disease, rabies and mad cow are exotic to Australia but can have severe impacts if they become established here. Landholders need to remain vigilant and immediately report any suspected emergency animal disease on 1800 675 888.

Landholders can also report exotic or emergency plant pests on 1800 084 881.

New approach to detecting Phylloxera

A project to develop sampling strategies for accurate and cost-effective <u>detection of Phylloxera</u> has collected over 500 soil samples since 2013. The project is continuing to fine tune the findings for use by the wine industry.

Nosema warning - Beekeepers are being urged to monitor their hives closely after mating flights showed that the so-called 'silent killer' <u>Nosema apis</u> can be sexually transmitted from infected drones to queens. Nosema is a highly infectious gut fungus which gives bees dysentery, reduces their lifespan, and can cause queens to stop laying eggs - leading to the collapse of a colony.

Varroa mite - Quarantine officials recently intercepted a colony of invasive bees carrying the Varroa mite which has the potential to have a catastrophic impact on food crops in Australia. <u>Landcare</u> <u>Australia</u> is currently raising funds to provide a lost-cost form of surveillance that will monitor hives for early detection of bee threats.

Chemical safety and training

SMARTtrain provide nationally accredited courses in the safe and effective use of agricultural and veterinary chemicals. There are several <u>upcoming courses</u> with flexible training options for both level 3 and level 4 training.

Long-term grazing trial links productivity benefits to improved grazing management

A Queensland study has been testing a number of grazing scenarios to determine sustainable and



profitable strategies for managing beef production in a highly variable climate.

The Australian Government's Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF) is currently providing incentives for the development of eligible greenhouse gas abatement projects. Some types of permanent tree plantings including existing plantings, planned new plantings, or assisted regeneration may be eligible to earn a revenue stream from carbon credit units contracted to the ERF.
