As part of her selection in the real-time training program, Dr Kelly will receive intensive training to recognise and sample animals for FMD. She will also visit and investigate potential cases of infection on Nepalese farms with FMD.

Farmers urged to report sightings of intensely irritating buffalo fly

The intensely irritating, blood-sucking buffalo fly, *Haematobia irritans exigua*, has been <u>reported</u> in the Central West in the Quambone and Macquarie Marshes areas.

We're calling on people in the cattle industry to report buffalo fly sightings as soon as possible to their local vet so that authorities can gain a better idea of how many properties may be affected and how far they have spread.

Buffalo fly aren't thought to survive all year round in the Central West, however they will migrate from the north and east of the state in the right seasonal conditions.



The Bureau of Meteorology has released their latest monthly <u>climate and water outlook video</u> – covering rainfall, streamflow and temperature for the next three months and beyond.


The <u>rainfall outlook for April to June</u> indicates wetter than normal conditions are likely across western and western-central NSW. There is a near-neutral outlook for remainder. This means there is a near-equal chance of drier or wetter than normal conditions in these areas.
